#### 6. Adjournment:

Sec. 22-336. - Plumbing inspector.

There is established a plumbing inspection division for the regulation of the installation, alteration, and use of plumbing, as provided herein. The plumbing inspection division shall consist of the chief the position of plumbing inspector and such other employees as may be provided who shall work under the supervision of by the Director of Buildings. The plumbing inspector inspection division shall be charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of the rules and regulations relating to the installation, alteration, and use of plumbing, as provided for by ordinance and shall function under the immediate supervision and control of the director of buildings. The position of Plumbing Inspector may be filled, subject to funding by the City Council, by an employee or by an independent contractor. Alternatively, the position of plumbing inspector may be left vacant in which case, the City may utilize the services of the State of Illinois Plumbing Inspectors who shall have all of the powers of the Plumbing Inspector set forth in this Code.

Sec. 22-337. - Duties of plumbing inspector.

- (a) It shall be the duty of the plumbing inspector to sign and issue all notices and inspection certificates required, to pass on all plans submitted, to keep or cause to be kept daily record of his work, including all notices and applications received, violation of these regulations, and all other matters which may pertain thereto. He shall inspect all buildings in the course of erection or undergoing alterations, as often as may be necessary and shall see that the construction and reconstruction of the plumbing, drainage and plumbing ventilation shall conform with the rules and regulations established by this article. He shall also, in addition to his other duties, ascertain whether the plumber having charge of the construction, repair or alteration of any plumbing work performed or about to be performed, and such person performing such work in the city, has a certificate granting him such right as provided for in the state statutes. If any such person has no certificate or right to do the work, the inspector shall forthwith proceed to prosecute any violations. He may in the performance of his duties enter any building or premises in the city.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the plumbing inspector to prefer charges with the department of registration and education of the state for the revocation of a certificate of license of any plumber or a certificate of registration of any plumber's apprentice for any willful violation of this article, or of any law of the state regulating the conduct or installation of plumbing work.
- (c) He shall The Plumbing Inspector may condemn and reject all work done, or being done, or materials used, or being used, which do not in all respects conform to the provisions of this article and amendments thereto, and shall order such changes in workmanship or materials as will make the same conform thereto.
- (d) The Plumbing Inspector may, in coordination with the Director of Buildings, take such action, with respect to any building, premises or part thereof, which is not in compliance with this Code or the State of Illinois Plumbing Code to enforce the relevant code, including but not limited to any summary action permitted by the relevant code or referral of the violation to the office of the City Attorney for prosecution.
- (d) Whenever the plumbing inspector shall find any building, premises or part thereof in or on which there is being maintained a plumbing or drainage system or part thereof in a defective, leaking or unsanitary condition, or in which plumbing or drainage work is being or has been installed in violation of this article, it shall be his duty to notify cause notice to be given, in writing, to the owner, agent or person responsible for the premises in which such condition exists, or in which such work is being or has been installed, to correct such condition, or to remove or cause to be reinstalled such work as has been installed in violation of this article. Such notice shall specify a reasonable time in which such conditions shall be corrected, or in which such work shall be removed or reinstalled, as the case may be.

- (e) Should any person served by such notice fail or refuse to comply with the orders contained therein within the time specified, or fail to commence in good faith to comply with such orders, the plumbing inspector shall notify the city attorney of such fact. The notification shall be in writing, accompanied by a copy of the notice and such other information as the city attorney may require or direct.
- (f) On receipt of notification from the plumbing inspector to the effect that notice has been served by him, which notice contained orders requiring the correction of leaking, defective or unsanitary conditions in connection with a plumbing and drainage system, or the removal, repair, installation or reinstallation of work in connection with a plumbing and drainage system, which is being or has been installed in a manner contrary to the provisions of this article and the person named in such notice as being responsible therefor having failed, refused or failed to commence in good faith to comply with the orders contained in such notice within the time specified, it shall be the duty of the city attorney or other officer charged with such duty to cause compliance with such orders by that person, in accordance with and in the manner provided for by law.

Sec. 22-338. - Right of entry.

The plumbing inspector shall wear an official badge of office, and on exhibition thereof shall have the right of entry in and on all buildings and premises in the City for the purpose of making inspections, reinspections or otherwise performing such duties as may be necessary in the enforcement of the provisions of the State of Illinois Plumbing Code and this article Code and amendments thereto.

Sec. 22-339. - Plumbing inspector's salary.

The salary of the plumbing inspector shall be determined by the City Council.

Re: Storm Water Utility Feasibility Study

The current budget includes \$100,000 for the feasibility study and possible implementation of a storm water utility for the City of Belvidere. A storm water utility was one of the seven possible general fund revenue sources presented to the City Council as part of our 2020 budget process. A storm water utility would operate similar to water and sewer, with a fee charged for the control of storm water runoff through construction, operation and maintenance of a storm sewer system.

A request for statements of interest and qualifications was sent out to eight consulting firms, with five responding. The submittals from the five responding firms were reviewed and ranked by the Mayor, City Attorney, Public Works Director, Public Works Superintendent, Public Works Committee Chairman and Public Works Committee Vice-Chairman. Interviews were then conducted with the three highest ranked firms.

Based on those interviews, the team of Fehr Graham and Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions was selected to provide a proposal to the City for conducting a storm water feasibility study. A copy of their proposal is attached for your reference.

I would recommend approval of the proposal from Fehr Graham/Wood, in an amount not-to-exceed \$48,370.00, for completing a storm water utility feasibility study for the City of Belvidere. This work will be paid for from capital project funds.

Dear Mr. Anderson:

Fehr Graham is pleased to present you with the following proposal for civil engineering services as they relate to the above-referenced project. As we understand, the City of Belvidere (City) would like to complete a stormwater utility feasibility study.

#### **SCOPE OF PROJECT**

The scope of the study will include the following items as presented in the Statement of Interest/Statement of Qualifications sent by the City to solicit engineering services for this project.

- 1. Program description, assessment and policy development.
- 2. Develop cost structure for operation, maintenance and development.
- 3. Review and evaluation of available funding methodologies.
- Cost/rate modeling including equivalent residential unit (eru) calculations.
- Review billing options, policies, and integration with the existing system.
- 6. Develop a plan for public education and outreach.
- 7. Final Report.

Fehr Graham and its sub-consultant, Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions, Inc., will provide services as described in this letter proposal. The objective of the study is to provide documentation of a preliminary analysis of the feasibility of creating a stormwater utility in Belvidere to generate funding for the City's use in managing, maintaining, and replacing stormwater infrastructure as a part of their stormwater management program.

A detailed scope of services follows.

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

#### Task 1 - Project Management

The stormwater utility feasibility study will require coordination with the city and select city stakeholders. This includes regular project updates with the city, internal status meetings, and on-site meetings.

The following meetings are included in this scope of services and anticipated during the completion of this study. Additional meetings can be attended on a time and materials basis.

Kick-Off Meeting with City of Belvidere Staff (1 Meeting)

Project Update Meeting after Preliminary Stormwater

Management Program and Rate Structures are Developed (1 Meeting)

Meetings with Key Ratepayers to Explain Rate Structure (Up to 5 Meetings)

#### Task 2 - Stormwater Management Program Assessment and Development

#### **Assessment**

To determine the funding needs of the City's stormwater infrastructure, the existing stormwater management program will be compared to the dedicated funding available now. In order to determine existing program elements, the City will provide NPDES stormwater data, age/type/size/location of stormwater infrastructure in Belvidere, current rehabilitation/replacement program, and other information related to stormwater expenditures.

A summary of the annual stormwater management program budget needs and the funding dedicated to the stormwater management program will be provided in a section of the final report.

#### Development

In order to anticipate future needs and create a sustainable stormwater management program, the existing program will be updated to meet the comprehensive stormwater needs of the City. The updated program will consider inclusion of administration costs, inspections, maintenance, capital projects and expenditures, NPDES Phase II, floodplain program, instream water quality issues, minor and major improvements and repairs, and professional services. The City will assist in the process of prioritizing items based on immediate and future needs.

The stormwater management program will then be translated into a five-year stormwater management budget including costs of the prioritized elements, depreciation of assets, debt costs, and anticipated annual revenues from funding sources. The stormwater management program and the five-year stormwater management budget will be presented for review and concurrence by the City before submission of the final report. A summary of the stormwater management program development will be provided in the final report.

#### Task 3 - Funding Methodology

The stormwater utility billing method will be determined based on the City's ability to assess and bill a stormwater fee. The availability of GIS datasets now and in the future will be considered along with the billing process and database management system currently being utilized for water and sewer fees and property taxes. The City has indicated its desire to use the water and sewer bills for this purpose, but a cursory review of up to three options will be completed as a part of this study. Initial recommended funding methodology will be presented for review and concurrence by the City before submission of the final report. The final recommended funding methodology will be described in a narrative section of the final report.

#### Task 4 - Cost/Rate Modeling

Several methods of computing stormwater utility rates are used as industry standards which will be considered when developing a cost/rate structure. Properties can be given a flat rate across the entire city, rates can be determined by the zoning designation, and rates can be determined by calculating the impervious surface coverage within their property. Up to three rate methods will be evaluated based on complexity and timeline of implementation and their ability to provide adequate funding.

The City will provide GIS datasets for the purpose of assessing the impervious surface coverage on various land uses within Belvidere. It is assumed that the City does not currently have impervious surface area for all of its parcels. A sample analysis based on select parcels will be completed to determine the impact of billing different properties based on Equivalent Rate Units (ERUs).

Based on the evaluation of the options above, a preliminary cost/rate model will be developed and presented to the City and key ratepayers (up to 5 ratepayers). Feedback from these meetings will be used to inform the recommended cost/rate model for use in this study. The evaluation of cost/rate methods and the recommended cost/rate model will be described in a section of the Final Report.

#### Task 5 - Implementation Requirements

The recommended stormwater management program, funding methodology, and cost/rate structure will be used as the basis for the implementation requirements. A list of policies and local codes that will be updated and affected by the implementation of the stormwater utility will be compiled for review by the City. The requirements include the scope, schedule, and cost of the professional services needed to implement a stormwater utility in Belvidere. Key items for implementation along with a critical path schedule will be provided to the City. The City will be presented with the implementation requirements for review and concurrence before the final report is submitted. The final Implementation requirements will be included as a section of the final report.

#### Task 6 - Public Outreach Plan

A plan for public outreach during the implementation phase of the study will be drafted for City review. This will include discussion of typical issues encountered during a public process, a timeline of meetings/engagement opportunities and intended audience, a mission statement and key messaging points, social media and online engagement plan, printed materials distribution plan, and identification of groups of users that need to be engaged personally. The public outreach plan will be presented to the City for review and concurrence before the final report is submitted. The public outreach plan will be included as a section of the final report.

#### Task 7 - Final Report

After substantial progress has been made on Tasks 2-6, a draft report will be submitted to the City for review. The City will provide comments to be addressed in a final submittal of the completed stormwater utility feasibility study. As indicated in the sections above, the elements of Tasks 2-6 will be described and summarized in the draft and final reports submitted to the City as the main deliverable of this study.

#### Alternate Task 1 - GIS Stormwater Infrastructure Layer

During the initial scoping meeting for this study, the City expressed interest in the consultant team completing GIS data entry to complete their stormwater infrastructure layers. This includes the data entry for the location and size of storm sewers and the location of storm structures in ArcMap to be transferred to the City in shapefile format. This includes areas in red shown on the attached GIS Storm Sewer Update Areas map. It does not include topographic survey and field measurements of stormwater infrastructure. It does not include the entry of rim or invert elevations for storm structures. This work can be started during the feasibility study or it can be started during the implementation phase. This service can be added on a time and materials basis costing \$5,000 to \$7,000. This cost is not included in the following fees section for the stormwater utility feasibility study.

#### **SCHEDULE**

It is anticipated that the feasibility study will be completed in four months or less.

#### **EXCLUSIONS**

The following items are **not** included in the scope of services proposed here within:

- > Presentation to the City Council
- Public Meetings

Any of the above services can be performed as an additional cost to the project upon request.







Re: Smoke Free Belvidere

Recently, the State of Illinois increased the age at which an individual may purchase tobacco from 18 to 21 years of age. In order to remain consistent I recommend modifying the City's ordinances relating to minors purchasing and possessing tobacco and alternative products to reflect the new state age limit.

Attached are the relevant Belvidere code sections with proposed changes shown in strikeout and underline.

RECOMMENDATION: Motion to amend sections 74-258 and 74-259 of the City of Belvidere Municipal Code to increase the age limits for tobacco and alternative nicotine products from 18 to 21 years of age as set forth in the attached draft. This will return to council in ordinance form.

Sec. 74-258. - Minor possession or use of tobacco.

- (a) No minor person under 18 21 years of age shall buy any tobacco product. No minor under 18 years No person under 21 years of age shall possess any cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco, or tobacco in any of its forms. A person under 18 21 years of age shall not possess an alternative nicotine product as defined in section 1.5 of the Prevention of Tobacco Use by Minors and Sale and Distribution of Tobacco Products Act (720 ILCS 675/1.5).
- (b) It is not a violation of this section for a person under 48 21 years of age to purchase or possess a cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco or tobacco in any of its forms if the person under the age of 21 48 purchases or is given the cigar, cigarette, smokeless tobacco or tobacco in any of its forms from a retail seller of tobacco products or an employee of the retail seller pursuant to a plan or action to investigate, patrol, or otherwise conduct a "sting operation" or enforcement action against a retail seller of tobacco products or a person employed by the retail seller of tobacco products or on any premises authorized to sell tobacco products to determine if tobacco products are being sold or given to persons under 48-21 years of age if the "sting operation" or enforcement action is approved by, conducted by, or conducted on behalf of the department of state police, the county sheriff, a municipal police department, the department of revenue, the department of public health, or a local health department. It is also not a violation of this section for a person minor, under the age of 21 48. to possess any tobacco product where such use takes place under the direct supervision and approval of the minor's parent or legal guardian and such use takes place in the privacy of a private residence or established place of worship or tribal meeting place. In the event such use takes place in a place of worship or tribal meeting place, tobacco may be possessed by a minor under 18 only where its use is a part of a religious or tribal ceremony.
- (c) A <u>person</u> minor—who violates any provision of this section shall be fined not less than \$50.00 or sentenced to not less than 20 hours of community service or both for a first offense. The minimum fine a subsequent offense shall be in accordance with section 1-9 of the city Municipal Code and the court may sentence the minor to not less than 30 hours of community service in addition to or in lieu of such fine.

Sec. 74-259. - Sale of tobacco or alternative nicotine products to minors persons under 21 prohibited.

- (a) No person shall sell, offer for sale, give or deliver tobacco products or alternative nicotine products to any person under the age of 48 <u>21</u> years. The terms tobacco products and alternative nicotine products shall have the same definition as in the Prevention of Tobacco Use by Minors and Sale and Distribution Act.
- (b) All business owners of the location where a prohibited sale takes place, including but not limited to individual owners and/or partners of any partnership or officers of any corporation, are accountable for their own individual violations of this section and for the actions of their employees or agents in violation of this section that take place while conducting business on behalf of the owner(s) or officers and shall be subject to the penalties provided for in this section. As such, they may be prosecuted and fined for the acts of their employees and agents, said fines and prosecution being in addition to any fines and prosecution of the individual making a prohibited sale.
- (c) This section shall not limit or alter any statute of the State of Illinois pertaining to the sale, possession or distribution of tobacco or alternative nicotine products. Prosecution of one or more defendants pursuant to the City of Belvidere Municipal Code shall not prevent the prosecution and imposition of fines or other sanctions under state statute of the same or additional defendants.
- (d) Any person who violates this section shall be fined not less than \$250.00 and not more than \$5,000.00 plus costs. Upon a second or subsequent conviction of this section, the business registration license issued by the city may be suspended or revoked in accordance with Article III of Chapter 26 of this Code.
