# ORDINANCE # AN ORDINANCE REPEALING DIVISION 6, OVERSIZE VEHICLE PARKING, OF ARTICLE IV, of CHAPTER 110, OF THE CITY OF BELVIDERE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the size and location of driveways as well as the parking of recreational and commercial motor vehicles on private property are now regulated by the City of Belvidere Zoning Code, 150.01 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of those portions of the City of Belvidere Zoning Code should, by operation of law repeal prior inconsistent ordinances; and

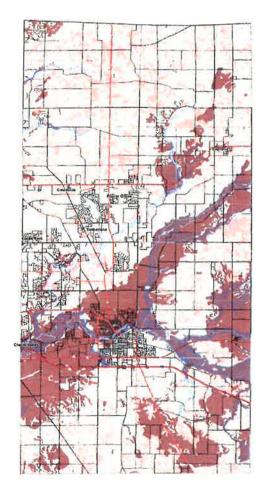
WHEREAS, Division 6 of Article IV or Chapter 110 is a prior inconsistent ordinance which the City Council wishes to ensure is repealed by affirmative action to avoid future confusion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Belvidere as follows:

- SECTION 1: Division 6 of Article IV of Chapter 110, consisting of Sections 110-321, 110-322, 110-323 and sections 110-325-110-355 (previously repealed and reserved), is repealed and reserved.
- SECTION 2: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 3:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **SECTION 4:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in pamphlet form as required by law which publication is hereby authorized.

### **Data Sources and Explanations**

- Boone County Soil Survey Table 6 Limitations Affecting Cropland and Pastureland
  - This information identifies soils which may have limitations affecting cropland and pastureland such as erosion, poor tilth, high PH, excessive permeability, wetness and ponding. For the purposes of the SARA map only soils with the limitation of "excessive permeability" were used. Excessive permeability is defined as "The lower limit of the permeability range within the soil profile is 6 inches or more (water infiltration) per hour."
- Circular 531 Plate 2
  - Plate 2 was used to identify areas of dolomite within 20 feet of the land surface, sand and gravel (usually greater than 50 feet thick) at land surface and sand and gravel within 20 feet of land surface overlain by till or other fine to medium textured material. This information was used as these geologic characteristics would identify the areas of highest rate of

water recharge into the ground. These areas are reflected in the SARA map as the highest potential for recharge.

#### Circular 531 Plate 3

• Plate 3 was used to identify areas of highest potential for groundwater contamination. During the SARA map creation we used the 5 highest categories for potential for groundwater contamination which are beginning at the highest: Dolomite within 5 feet of land surface, sand and gravel at land surface, Dolomite between 5 and 20 feet of land surface overlain by sandy or sandy loam till or other fine to medium textured material, Dolomite between 5 and 20 feet of land surface overlain by loamy to silty-clay till or other fine to medium textured material and sand and gravel within 20 feet of land surface overlain by till or other fine to medium textured material. These areas are reflected in the SARA map as "Type A" or the highest potential for recharge.

### Boone County Soil Survey – Table 24 Water Features

- Table 24 gives estimates of various water features. The estimates are used in land use planning that involves engineering considerations. Soils are assigned to one of four groups according to the rate of water infiltration when the soils are not protected by vegetation, are thoroughly wet, and receive precipitation from long-duration storms. For the purposes of the SARA map Hydrologic Group A and B was used. *Group A* is defined as Soils having a high infiltration rate (low runoff potential) when thoroughly wet. These consist mainly of deep, well drained to excessively drained sands or gravelly sands. These soils have a high rate of water transmission. *Group B* is defined as Soils having a moderate infiltration rate when thoroughly wet. These consist chiefly of moderately deep or deep, moderately well drained or well drained soils that have moderately fine texture to moderately course texture. These soils have a moderate rate of water transmission.
- Dual Hydrologic groups were also included in the map to identify soils
  that have soils characteristics that fit the study at least part of the time.
  If a soil was defined as Dual Hydrologic Group the first group is for
  drained areas and the second group if for undrained areas.
- Once all Group A and Group B soils were identified any soils with a slope greater than 5% was removed to narrow down the highest areas of potential recharge.
- All soils that did not intersect high risk areas from *Plate 2* and *Plate 3* are identified on the map as a "Type B" SARA area.

### Final Data Layers

- Type A Type A is illustrated on the map in a dark red color which identifies the areas in the county that according to the collected data above one can expect the highest and fastest rate of recharge.
- Type B Type B is illustrated on the map in a light red color which identifies areas in the county that according to the soil characteristics one can expect a high rate of infiltration to the soil and have potential for recharge. The main difference between Group A and Group B is the underlying geology for Group B doesn't present as high of a risk to deeper water sources as Group A but still has a high potential for ground water recharge.

My wife and I live at 515 Calgary Way, Belvidere, II. On June 28<sup>th</sup>, 2017, our basement flooded with in excess of 15 inches of sewage. As a result, we suffered damages to our property of \$32,394.00. This includes the cost of clean-up, replacement of property lost, and the cost of restoration of our home.

We have attempted to file a claim with our insurance company, but due to 3 previous sewage losses, since we lived in our home, we were not covered for any additional losses caused by sewage back up. Additionally, we file a claim with the city insurance company for the losses, but our claim was denied.

As mentioned, we have now suffered 4 sewage back-ups since we moved into our newly constructed home in 1996. On the previous occasions, we were told the flooding was caused by serval different issues. They range from the removal of a pump station on the west side of IL Rte 20, power loss at the pump station in our neighborhood, a failure of the pump in our neighborhood, and that other residents of Belvidere pumping grey water into the sewage system. Additionally, on each of those occasions, we were told the problem was fixed, yet we continue to have sewage back-up issues. The city's recommendation was for wife and I to install a sewage check valve to prevent the sewage from backing up into our home. The cost of installing the unit is \$3,987.16. We are having the check valve installed this week.

We have followed the protocol, outlined by Mr. Anderson, with regard to the sewage issue and filing a claim with the city. We are requesting the City of Belvidere reimburse us for the cost of damages sustained and for the full cost of the installation of the sewage back-up check valve.

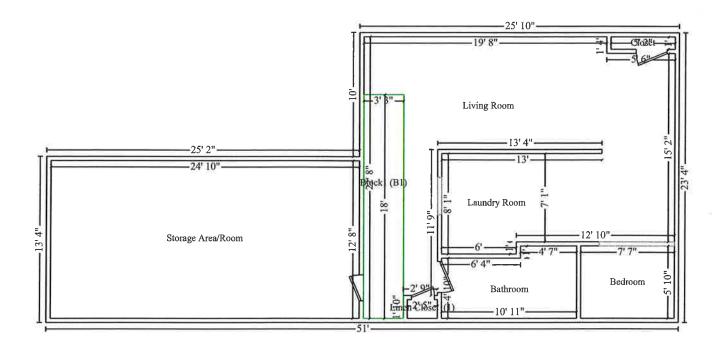

### RE: Tax Levy Request from the Belvidere Police Pension Fund 2017

Dear Mayor Chamberlain and Members of the City Council:

Section 3-125 of the Illinois Pension Code provides that the City of Belvidere must annually levy a tax to meet the annual actuarial requirements of the police pension fund (40 ILCS 5/3-125). The Board of Trustees of the Belvidere Police Pension Fund recently reviewed the actuarial report prepared by actuary Todd A. Schroeder of Lauterbach & Amen, LLP for purposes of the next City tax levy

In light of the Board's fiduciary obligation to ensure funds are available to meet the actuarial requirements of the Fund, the Board voted to request that the City Council levy the suggested actuarial amount of \$1,246,427 on behalf of the Belvidere Police Pension Fund in December 2017. Note the following highlights:

- The recommended contribution has increased \$95,750 from the prior year, an 8.3% increase over last year's recommended contribution.
- The funded percentage has improved to 62.35% on an actuarial value of assets basis.
- According to the actuary the City can expect a 3 to 4% increase in the recommended contribution each year, which accounts for \$40,274 of the increased contribution this year. However, unexpected changes primarily from demographic changes and asset returns being less than expected resulted in additional contribution requirements of \$55,476.
- The year's return on investments was 6.5%, net of administrative expenses. When smoothing (the recognition of gains and losses over five years) was considered, the return on investments on the actuarial value of assets was 5.0% net of administrative expenses.

The Board encourages the City to continue its commitment to properly funding the Fund. Enclosed please find the actuarial valuation, annual municipal compliance report, and the Fund's investment policy for your review. If you have any questions regarding the Board's request or would like a representative of the Board to attend the City Council meeting at which our request will be discussed, please let us know.

Dear Mayor Chamberlain and Members of the City Council:

The Board of Trustees of the Belvidere Fire Pension Fund recently reviewed the actuarial report prepared by Lauterbach & Amen, LLP for purposes of the next City tax levy; the Board voted unanimously at its October 2017 meeting to request that the City Council levy the suggested actuarial amount of \$1,065,291 on behalf of the Belvidere Fire Pension Fund. This amount is based using an investment return of 7.0% under the entry age normal actuarial method and following a 100% funding policy by year 2040.

Note the following highlights from the actuarial study:

- The Actuarial Liability has increased from \$25,604,729 to 26,182,273.
- The recommended contribution has increased \$32,365 from the prior year (3.1%).
- The funded percentage has increased on an actuarial value of assets basis from 56.60% last year to 57.40% this year.
- The Investment Return on Assets net of fees for the period was 9.3%.
