ORDINANCE NO. 715H

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE TO ALLOW A MURAL WITHIN THE CB, CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (323 South State Street)

WHEREAS, The City of Belvidere has adopted Chapter 150, Zoning Ordinance in accordance with the provisions of Illinois Compiled Statutes to regulate the use of land and to specify the minimum requirements for improvements on land in the City of Belvidere; and

WHEREAS, Special Uses are certain municipal or private uses that due to their physical or operational characteristics may pose a threat to the value, use and enjoyment of adjoining property; are reviewed on a case by case basis; and are permitted only by permission of the Belvidere City Council; and,

WHEREAS, The applicant, Boone County Arts Council, PO Box 311, Belvidere, IL 61008 on behalf of the property owners, Jeffrey and Deborah Carlson, 1540 Whitney Boulevard, Belvidere, IL 61008 is requesting a special use to allow a mural at 323 South State Street; and

WHEREAS, after due notice by publication pursuant to the Illinois State Statutes, the City of Belvidere Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on February 11, 2025 concerning the proposed Special Use; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Belvidere Planning and Zoning Commission having examined the application and having considered the evidence, both oral and documentary and being fully advised about the premises did make findings of fact and a recommendation; and,

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the City considered the findings of fact and concur with the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELVIDERE, BOONE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. That a Special Use in the CB, Central Business District to allow for a mural on the property depicted in Attachment A and legally described as:

All that part of the premises hereinafter described falling Southwesterly of the Southwesterly line of State Street and Northeasterly of a line 115 feet perpendicularly distant Southwesterly from and parallel to the Southwesterly line of State Street; Part of Block 2 and part of Lots 1 and 6 in Block 4 of Aaron Whitney's Addition to the Town (now City) of Belvidere, the Plat of which Addition is recorded in Book "C" of Deeds on page 271 in the Recorder's Office of Boone County, Illinois and part of Lots 2, 6, 11 and 12 of Joel Walker's Second Addition to Belvidere, the Plat of which Addition is recorded in Book "C" of Deeds, on page 226, in said Recorder's Office, all bounded and described as follow to wit: Beginning at a point in the Northeasterly line of said Lot 8 in Block 4 of Aaron Whitney's Addition distance 5.97 feet Northwesterly from the most Easterly corner of said lot, said point of beginning being 22.5 feet perpendicularly distant Northwest of the center line of the main track of the Chicago and North Westerly Railway Company, running Northeasterly and Southwesterly across said lots; thence Northwesterly, along the Northeasterly line of said Lot 8 a distance 24.03 feet to a point 30 feet Northwesterly, measured along said lot line, from the most Easterly corner of said Lot 8; thence Southwesterly 248.79 feet in a direct line to a point in the Southwesterly line of Lot 1 in Block 4 of said Aaron Whitney's Addition distance 60 feet, measured along said line. Northwesterly from the most Southerly corner of said Lot 1; thence Southeasterly, along the Southwesterly line of said Lot 1, a distance of 2.32 feet to a point 40 feet perpendicularly distance Northwest of the center line of the main track of the Chicago and North Western Railway Company running Northeasterly and Southwesterly across said lots; thence Southwesterly, along a line 40 feet perpendicularly distant Northwest of and parallel with the center line of said main track, 134.73 feet to its intersection with the Southwesterly line of Lot 2 of said Joel Walker's Second Addition; thence Northwesterly along the line between Lots 2 and 6 of said Joel Walker's Second Addition, 55.33 feet to the most Northerly corner of said Lot 6; thence Southwesterly, along the Northwesterly line of said Lot 6, to the most Westerly corner of said Lot 6; thence Southeasterly, along the Southwesterly line of said Lot 6, a distance of 36.1 feet to its intersection with a line 40 feet perpendicularly distant Northwest of and parallel with the center line of the main tract of the aforesaid Railway Company; thence Southwesterly, parallel with the main tract, 142 feet; thence Southeasterly, at right angles from the previous course, 17.5 feet; thence Northeasterly,

parallel with the center line of said main tract, 662.82 feet to the point of beginning, situated in the County of Boone, in the State of Illinois. PIN: 05-25-353-012

is hereby approved, subject to the following conditions:

- The mural shall be maintained by the Boone County Arts Council and Property Owner according to Belvidere's Zoning Ordinance requirements. If the mural shall fall into disrepair, then it shall be removed from the subject property.
- 2. The mural shall be in substantial conformance with the narrative provided by the applicant. (Attachment B)
- **Section 3.** That the premises shall be used in accordance with and subject to the applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Belvidere and shall not be used except as may otherwise be expressly authorized by the applicable law and the special use.
- **Section 4.** That acceptance of any of the benefits of this Special Use shall be deemed acceptance of all the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- **Section 5**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **Section 6**. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

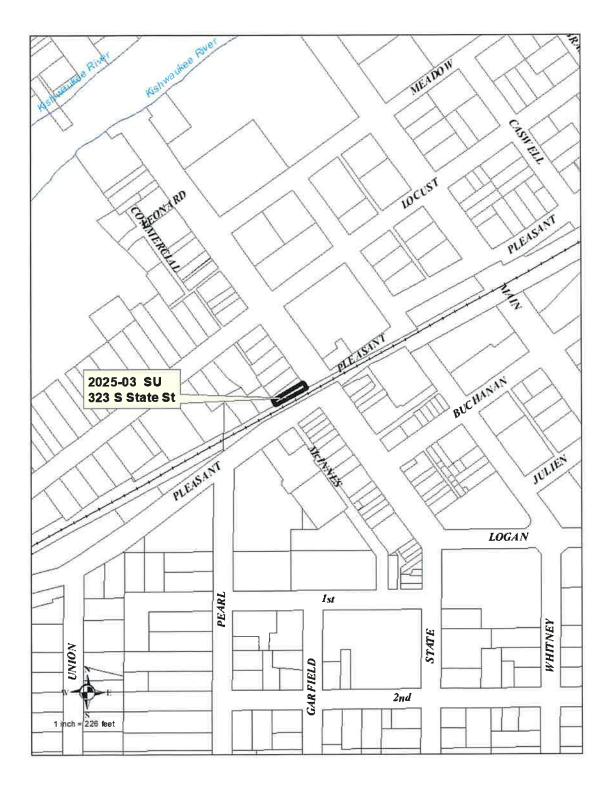

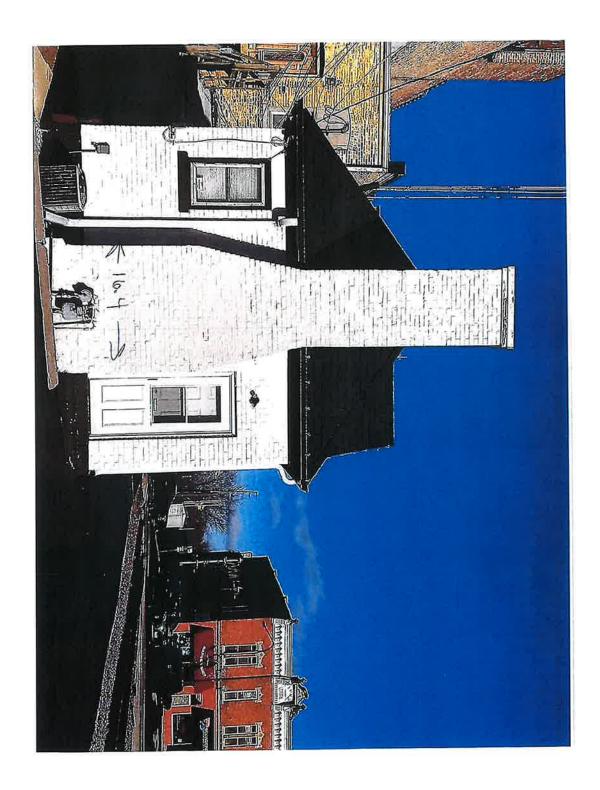
Proposed Mural to Honor Railroad Heritage at Historic O.H. Wright & Company

REQUEST AND LOCATION:

The Boone County Arts Council, PO Box 311, Belvidere, IL 61008 on behalf of the property owners, Jeffrey and Deborah Carlson, 1540 Whitney Boulevard, Belvidere, IL 61008, is requesting a special use to paint a mural at 323 South State Street within the CB, Central Business District (Belvidere Zoning Ordinance Sections 150.1012(A)(1) and 150.904 Special Use Review and Approval Procedures). The proposed mural will be railroad themed and painted on the western wall, along the chimney. The building was originally built one-foot onto the railroad property. This allowed business transactions to occur without staff needing to leave the building or exit the train. In 1971 the building was moved approximately 10 feet in order to avoid potential obstructions with the railroad.

The mural will not cover any architectural features or openings. The chimney is 16.4 feet at its widest point and is visible to those traveling eastbound along West Pleasant Street. Most newer murals are painted onto panels that are affixed to the brick walls. This allows for easier maintenance and repairs. However, since the building is already painted white, there is already the anticipation of maintenance in regards to the painted brick. Maintaining the mural will require similar effort.

TREND OF DEVELOPMENT:

The subject property is located downtown in an area of established mixed-use, commercial and institutional uses.

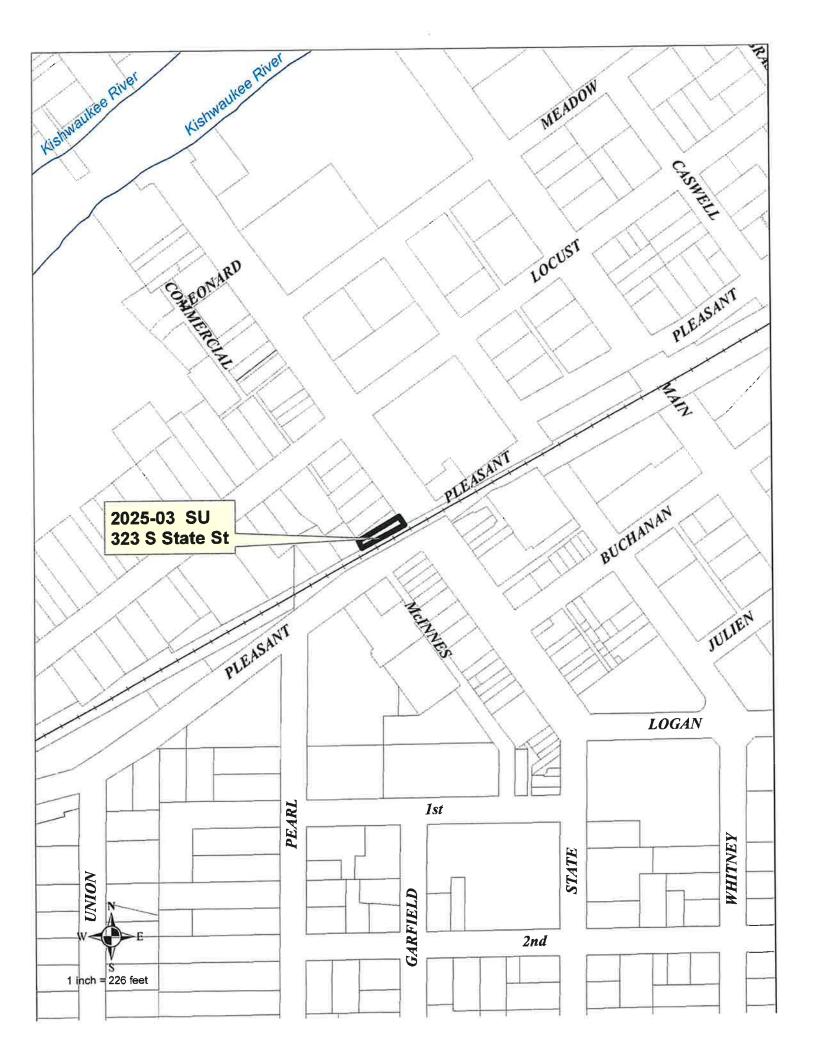

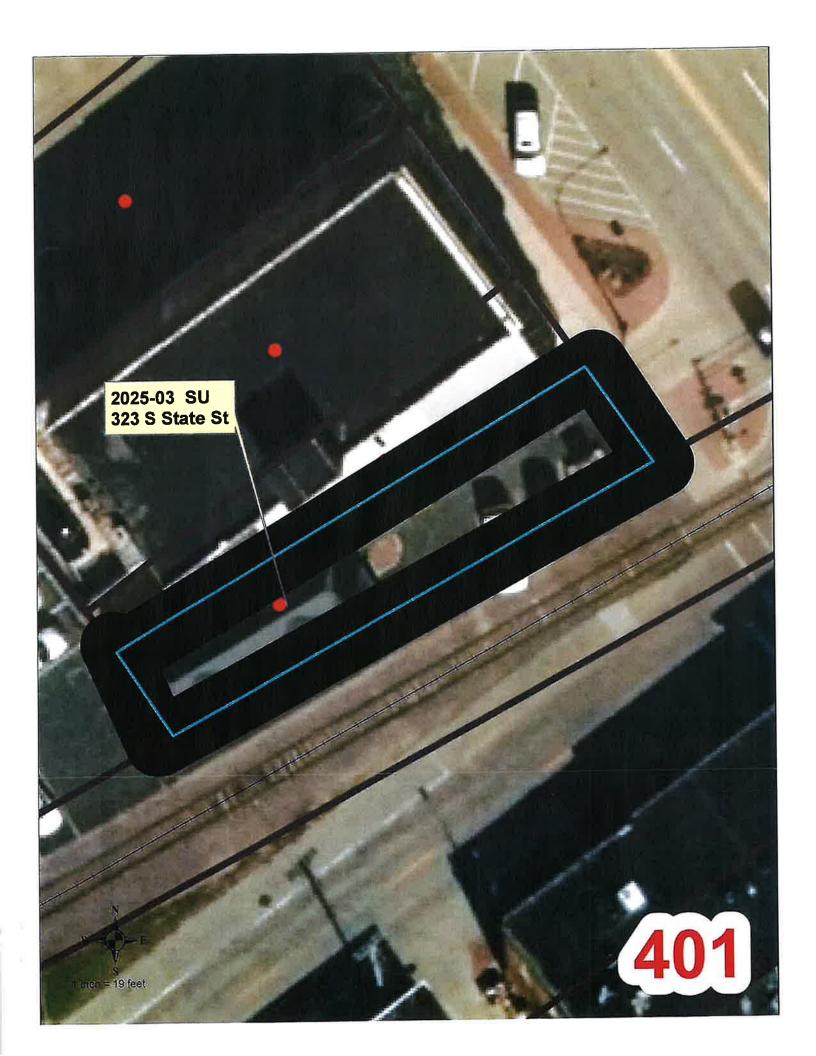

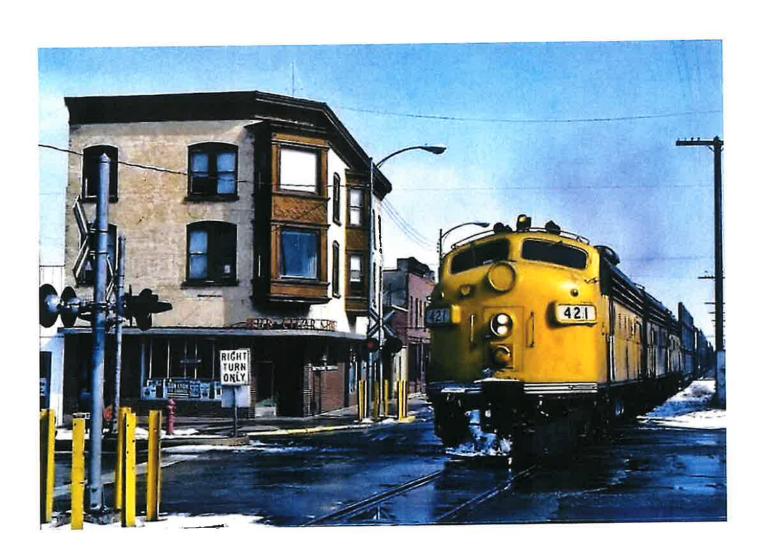
